Just last week, I sat in a little Mexican restaurant with a couple of local pastors, and our discussion turned to a conversation on the "fear of the Lord." It seemed to be our consensus that, in the days in which we are living, there seems to be a falling away from this biblical truth, and just maybe, we pastors and the church at large may have a hand in this disturbing trend.

The definition of fear as seen in Scripture takes at least three directions. The first is a picture of sheer terror and fright as Moses shares what the nations will experience as the Lord provides victories for Israel over its foes. The second is fear leads to service unto the Lord similar to what a servant may experience toward a master. And finally, we can see fear in the reverence and awe Isaiah expresses in his encounter with the King high and lifted up in Isaiah 5:1-6.

The writer of the Proverbs, as well as the Psalmist speak to us about "the fear of the Lord." They tell us it is the beginning or foundation of wisdom and knowledge. For the unbeliever, it is the fear of judgement and eternal separation from God as seen in Luke 12:5 and Hebrews 10:31. While for the believer, it is the motivating factor in the complete surrender of our lives to him as Lord. In either sense, if this fear is missing, we will have an incorrect understanding of God, and thus a failing relationship with Him.

I do believe that Christ's invitation to the woman at the well and the woman caught in adultery in John 4 and John 8 are both beautiful pictures of our Lord's willingness to meet sinners right where they are, but with expectations of a change taking place as they surrender their lives to Him. It is a dangerous theology that allows a professing child of God to live any way they feel and expect a holy God to be accepting of their lifestyle.

As we carry Christ to every community, let us do so with a healthy reverence and awe for the God who loves us and the Savior who died for us. May we be willing to meet people right where they are with the wonderful message that Christ died so they may become "new creatures/ creations" in Christ; old things have passed away and all things have become new. New life is available and expected when you surrender your life to the Savior.

As I sit to put this article together, we are in the midst of Passion week, looking forward to all the celebrations surrounding the Easter holiday. Egg hunts, family cookouts, spring break and such have become fixtures for many families in our communities. For others who are believers, we have Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, sunrise services and the like to remind us of the sacrifice


