Recently, I have been spending time in I & II Samuel, looking at the life of King David. Someone described king David as the George Washington of the nation of Israel, which I think is a good comparison. Not only is he a national icon and hero for Israel, but a great example for all believers as "a man after God's own heart." I often hear, what makes David a man after God's own heart? I am sure there are many answers to this question, and here are a couple of things I saw as I was reading 2 Samuel 2. Following the death of David's nemesis, Saul, he inquired of the Lord, "Do I move back to my homeland of Judah?" To which the Lord responded, "yes." David then followed that up with, "To which city do I go?," and Lord replied, "Hebron." So, the first thing I see is that David was willing to seek guidance and direction from the Lord. Secondly, and it seems simplistic, David followed the direction that God had provided. In verse 3, David packed up his family, his men, and their families and moved to Hebron. Doesn't it make sense that the Being who is the Creator of the universe and who has never made a mistake would give good advice that would be beneficial to follow? Thirdly, I saw David's respect for his enemy. We are told in the New Testament it is easy to love our friends, but how do we treat our enemies? David showed great respect, in the next few verses for Saul and the office he held. David honored those that honored the former King. Finally, when the majority of Israel chose Ishbosheth as their next king, rather than David who was God's anointed, David did not pout or get mad and give up on God's plan. Rather than turning his back on God, he trusted the Lord, knowing he had been anointed and promised that he would be king of all Israel. His faith allowed him to trust that God's promise would become






